AVOID HIGH IMPACT ACTIVITIES, SUCH AS:

Powerboats; pesticides and fertilizers; gasoline-powered yard equipment; fireplaces and wood stoves; recreational off-road driving; hazardous cleaners and paints; products made from endangered species

PRIORITY ACTIONS FOR AMERICAN CONSUMERS
TRANSPORTATION

- Choose a place to live that reduces the need to drive
- Whenever practical, walk, bicycle, or take public transportation
- If you need a car, choose a fuel-efficient, low-polluting car

FOOD

- Eat less meat
- Buy certified organic produce

HOUSEHOLD OPERATIONS

- Make home modifications that will reduce your home's heating and water use
- Install efficient lighting and appliances
- Choose an electricity supplier offering renewable energy

RULES FOR RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION

- Give special attention to major purchases
- Look for opportunities to be a leader/role model
- Buy more of those things that help the environment
- Think about non-environmental reasons (for example, economic and quality of life) for reducing consumption
